

Survivor and Co-Survivor of the Year Awards - 2020

2020 Call for Entries

Susan G. Komen®, the global leader in the fight against breast cancer, celebrates survivorship. Breast cancer doesn't stop during a pandemic – and neither can we! Even though we are having a virtual DC MORE THAN PINK Walk this year, we will still honor survivors and co-survivors who make an impact. While we cannot honor the Survivor and Co-Survivor of the Year in person this year we will honor and acknowledge them on social media, media interviews, and on the day of the virtual Walk – September 12. We invite you to nominate your candidate for both of these awards. Nominations should be made separately for each category.

Survivor of the Year is a special honor bestowed upon a breast cancer survivor (male or female) who best exemplifies Komen's mission and goals, as judged by a panel of survivor peers. Please include specific examples of your candidate's accomplishments to strengthen your nomination. Nominees will be judged on the following qualifications:

- Supporting Komen and the mission to end breast cancer through:
 - outreach and support to fellow survivors in the community
 - raising awareness about the breast cancer cause locally
 - promoting Komen and the More Than Pink Walk
 - volunteering within one's community for Komen and other breast cancer organizations
 - raising funds through the Komen Washington, D.C. More Than Pink Walk
- Being a resident of the local More Than Pink Walk region in Washington, D.C., Maryland or Northern Virginia
- Willingness to be a local ambassador for Komen in the National Capital Region throughout the year

Co-Survivor of the Year recognizes someone who has gone above and beyond to support a breast cancer survivor, as judged by a panel of survivor peers. Please include specific examples of your candidate's accomplishments to strengthen your nomination. Nominees will be judged on the following qualifications:

- Supporting Komen and the mission to end breast cancer through:
 - assisting a breast cancer survivor through their breast cancer journey
 - raising awareness about breast cancer locally
 - promoting Komen and the More Than Pink Walk
 - volunteering within one's community for Komen and other breast cancer organizations
 - raising funds through the Komen Washington, D.C. More Than Pink Walk
- Being a resident of the local Race for the Cure region in Washington, D.C., Maryland or Northern Virginia
- Willingness to be a local ambassador for Komen in the National Capital Region throughout the year

To nominate someone, please describe in 750 words or less why you or someone you know should be the 2020 Susan G. Komen Washington, D.C. Virtual More Than Pink Walk® Survivor or Co-Survivor of the

Year.

Be sure to include specifics regarding how long they've participated with Komen, what their contribution has been, funds raised, where they've volunteered, how they've given back to others or to the community since or before their diagnosis – anything that highlights how they shine.

- The name of Survivor or Co-Survivor nominee (as applicable)
- Your Telephone Number

- Digital photo of the nominee (in .jpg format) and brief description of photo

The winning Survivor and the winning Co-Survivor will be selected by a volunteer committee of breast cancer survivors and past participants of the Walk, and will have demonstrated the greatest impact on their community as well as the spirit of survival

Deadline for submission is **Friday August 14, 2020**

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2020 Eligibility and Terms and Conditions

Eligibility: This 2020 Call for Entries is open to any individual (except for past years' winners) who is registered for the 2020 Susan G. Komen Washington, D.C. Virtual More Than Pink Walk®.

Submission and Other Requirements: Email entries only. No other method of entry will be accepted. Submissions must be in English and must not exceed 750 words in length. Participants who do not meet these requirements are ineligible to be selected as the winner. Susan G. Komen® reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to disqualify from eligibility any individual implicated in any action, or for any reason, which, in Komen's sole opinion, corrupts or affects the administration of this 2020 Call for Entries. All information submitted will be subject to, and will be treated in a manner consistent with, Komen's Terms of Use and Privacy Policy.

Notification: Each potential winner will be notified by email and/or phone call by Komen on August 21, 2020. In the event that a potential winner does not respond to such notification within 3 days of date of issuance, a disqualification will result and the submission which scored next highest according to the judging criteria shall be identified from among all remaining eligible submissions. Each potential winner may be required to execute a waiver and release of liability or documentation required by Komen.

General Conditions: This 2020 Call for Entries is a contest of skill designed to increase breast cancer awareness and may not be used for, or in connection with, any gambling. All applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations apply.
